What happens next?

Surrey Decides – Question Time:

Question Time runs over a series of 3 nights from the **9th to the 11th of May** and takes place in a hybrid format, with some candidates appearing in person in The Marquee, and others online.

You can watch Question Time on the big screen in The Marquee, live online from the Union website (ussu.co.uk) or on YouTube ([@surreyunion](https://www.youtube.com/@surreyunion)). If you want to ask a question during the debate you will need to be logged into the Union website and use the question box under the live feed.

Question Time is an opportunity for you to get to know the candidates and hear them discuss their manifesto points, over a series of debates which are chaired by student volunteers. The point of Question Time is to help you make an informed decision about how to vote, and also for candidates to practice making their arguments in public.

Voting will open online after Question Time and each student will receive an email with a unique code to enter the voting website. **You have until the 15th of May at 7pm to make your choice.**

Education #2

- Study on Postgraduate students to better understand how to increase support (more research materials, flexible deadlines, support with placements).
- Open week across departments - Masterclasses where students from other departments can join.
- Improve students employability - Highlight and encourage use of resources already available, and include new technical resources for students CV.

Life on Campus #3

- Students input on music in Rubix - let's change things a bit (Hiphop, Latin, Afrobeats, etc.)
- How to tutorials - Support for new students through videos in their first weeks in Surrey (cooking, laundry, get around campus, groceries, etc.)



1. IT'S TIME TO LISTEN

WHERE SHOULD I LIVE NEXT YEAR?

i will push for the creation of a space for people to share their experience with housing in Guildford with a clear guide of what to check when house hunting. I want to ensure students know how much is too much with rent and provide them with the information they need so noone is taken advantage of.

I NEED HELP, WHO CAN I TALK TO?

I want to make it easier for people to ask for help - I personally find the system very clinical and want to make it easier and more anonymous to ask for extra resources and assistance, whether academic or non-academic. We all need help sometimes, but the majority of us never end up asking for it, and I want to fix that!

There are so many people you can talk to at the University of Surrey that sometimes you might end up feeling a bit lost, which is why I want to make the signposting clearer for who to talk to to get the best advice. If you have a specific query about anything, there should be effectively a tree map of people you can search down until you find who to contact.
